s ummary Key messages from the meeting-

- Thailand had average 20.000 road tolls a year ,which is nearly 30 / 100,000 population.
- We are going to have 5th Master plan for road safety implemented during 2022-2027, aimed to reduce the mortality rate to 12/100.000 population by 2027 focused on MC rider injured by RTI (80% of the victims from RTI), young riders, speed management, M&E
- RS should be on top of the agenda for future sustainable development according to SDG
- Every RS key strategies should be implemented
- How we can do that to achieve our goal? –big challenge but it can be done
 - How policy can be change to implementation?

- Voice from UN to Thailand can much support.
- More responsibility from every stakeholders in the society working together with the government
- More work in the factory and establishment.
- Working at provincial level to implement the central policy should be essential
 - This is the main strategy in 5th master plan for RS to allocate the authority to local administrative organization (LAO)
 - Bangkok Metropolitan with committed roles and policy of Bangkok Governor
 - Alternative travelling advocated by Walking and biking foundation
- Stronger law enforcement
- * Raising the awareness through education among school children, important of helmet wearing-caring oneself like wearing the mask
 - Also one of the strategy in 5th Master plan-DDPM, RAVPC, TYI
- Big data management are planned to be the instrument for planning and M&E
 - Department of disease control will take responsibility on M&E
 - Research activities on RS by TARC
 - Thailand iRAP
 - Thailand NCAP
- Many other stakeholders working actively at the moment.
 - WR Thailand, Thai Health Promotion Foundation, WHO CCS RS, Don't Drive Drunk foundation, RAVPC, Thai Youth Institute, private sector and NGO
- There is great opportunity to discuss and future coordinate among Thai networks with UN and AIPF on RS area.
